Campus Bound and Wildflower Collaborate to Offer College Planning Services to Wildflower Families

In response to our parents’ feedback about other supports that would make a difference in their lives, Wildflower is offering a new service to our families with high-school aged children. In partnership with Campus Bound, a private college counseling service, we offer tuition-free programing and guidance to manage the complex college planning process.

Services offered in collaboration with Campus Bound, Eastern Bank, Apogee Camp and others include:

- College application preparation for students
- Financial aid tutorials for parents
- Information sharing about college-scholarship opportunities for children who have lost a parent

- Assistance for students interested in attending a college essay writing boot camp

This program evolved from comments made by Wildflower parents during our strategic-planning focus groups. Our first information sessions, focusing

on Financing College, took place in August. Our families loved the first session. One family wrote, “Thank you so much for helping us get (our son) back on track with his college applications.” We’re looking forward to great results from this new and innovative program.
